Policy:	Club Patrol Award Policy
Purpose:	To identify Club Policy on General Patrolling duties and eligibility for 100% patrol award status
Applies to: Members	All Coffs Harbour SLSC Eligible Patrolling
Adopted:	24 August 2014
Effective:	24 August 2014

The Club recognises that patrol activities are performed by suitably qualified volunteer members and encourages both current and potential members to provide volunteer patrol and rescue operations.

The Club will endeavour to provide appropriate training to enable volunteer members with the skills/requirements to undertake volunteer patrol duties as the demand arises.

Patrolling Members will be entitled to be recognised as a 100% patrolling member for a patrolling season subject to the following criteria:

- 1. Attendance on Patrols for the number of hours allocated to the patrolling member on the Clubs patrol roster for the relevant patrol season**
- 2. No more than 2 substitute Patrols may be accrued by a patrolling member at any one time without prior written agreement with the Director of Surf Life Saving.**
- 3. All substitution patrols are required to be honoured by the close of the season**
- 4. Should a patrolling member not attend a patrol, and a substitute not be organised, then the patrolling member shall not be eligible for recognition as a 100%patrol member**

Any variation to this policy for an individual member requires a written submission to, and approval from the Clubs Board of Management.
